Computer Education (ICT): 321 High Schools were implemented Computer Education out of 422 High Schools, with this Programme 11 Computers and 1 Printer and 1 kerosene generator with internet facility of 20 Hours per month and 2 faculty persons were appointed for teaching of computer education to the students of the school and Teacher Trainings on computer education.

Mid Day Meals Programme: 4031 schools were implemented this Programme in the district with 4,12,669 students were covered. Conversion Cost for Primary Schools: Rs.3.69/- and Upper Primary Schools and U.P. Sections of High Schools: Rs.4.17/-

Vidya Volunteers: Proposals were received from the Head Masters of High Schools for U P Sections of High Schools appointed 1461 Vidya Volunteers as per their requirement submitted through the District Collector, Anantapur during the academic year 2009-10.

- 100 Upper Primary Schools were upgraded as High Schools in the district.
- 85 High Schools were identified for construction of Lab, Library, Computer lab, Additional Class rooms and Toilet Blocks in each school with 31.3laks for the year 2009-10.
- 61 Model High Schools were sanctioned for Education Backward Blocks in the district.
